June 11

Race 1

1. City Route: Toyed with rivals in first for Jerry Hollendorfer, bullet drill in the interim for son of Globalize.
2. Baby Blake: Popped at first asking at Hollywood Park, blinkers on after claim by Mike Pender.
3. Sold Short: Got money in second career start, debuts for new barn after private purchase.

Longshot: Compass Rock: Scored at two furlongs for Adam Kitchingman, draws inside for first around a turn.

Race 2

1. Whispering Express: Has blossomed since joining Hollendorfer barn, won last pair by a combined 14 lengths.
2. Big Tsimmis: Defeated top selection in April, figures right there for Steve Sherman.
3. Three for Marino: Second Hollendorfer runner is 2-for-2 for stable, easy half mile work since raced.

Longshot: Ballistic Sue: Runner-up in race she had to have needed, moves forward second time back for Steve Miyadi.

Race 3

1. Soul in One: Graduated nicely in sprint, no reason to believe she won't handle trip and turf, flattered when second place finisher came back to win.
2. Call the Ten: Has fired in all three on turf, moves inside for Dennis Patterson.
3. Can I Do It Again: Got the money when shipped to this coast, player right back for Steve Specht.

Longshot: Big Honey Bee: Stretches out and tries grass for Hollendorfer, contender if adapts to changes.

Suggested play: Exacta boxes keying 7 with 1-2-4.

Race 4

1. Hamonic Motion: Had troubled trip when basically splitting field, reunited with Inoel Beato, his rider in both wins.
2. Japanese Comet: Fits better in this context, earned his two wins over Tapeta.
3. Thunderclap Newman: Back to route game for Rene Amescua, well clear of rest of field when completing exacta last month.

Longshot: California Colonel: Popped in second on the GG main, factor from close range for O J Jauregui.

Suggested play: Trifecta keying 3 with 2-4-7 with all and 2-4-7 with 3 with all.

Early 50 Cent Pick 4

Race 1-City Route and Baby Blake (Alternate: Sold Short).

Race 2-Whispering Express and Big Tsimmis (A: Three for Marino).

Race 3-Soul in One, Call the Ten and Can I Do It Again (A: Big Honey Bee).

Race 4-Thunderclap Newman, Japanese Comet and Hamonic Motion (A: California Colonel).

Total Cost (\$18)-2-4 with 5-6 with 1-2-7 with 3-4-7.

Race 5

1. Flammable Boom: Third nose in photo in second for this stable, might finally have found a field he can beat.
 2. Awesome Wonderer: Ran like horse in need of a race, now in Jedd Josephson stable.
 3. Milyone: Blew clear lead at 1-2, tries for 10th time to win on turf.
- Longshot: Santa's Love: Can be pace factor as he stretches out and switches to grass for Genaro Vallejo.

Race 6

1. Instinctual: Recent maiden winner was flattered when second place finisher came back to tally, tab right back in weak spot.
2. Renzo Sean: Burned his share of bucks, certainly a player, but tough trust at the anticipated short price.
3. Sovereign Lord: Lost 33 of 34, but comes off near miss for Jauregui and tough to leave out of exotics.

Longshot: Eckstein: Split field for Vann Belvoir, draws inside and new rider in Abel Cedillo.

Suggested play: Trifecta keying 6 with 1-5-8 with all and 1-5-8 with 6 with all.

Race 7

1. Big Sky Posse: Completed exacta at 5-1 behind past classer Moudez, down a peg for Tim McCanna.
2. Tropical Heat: Claiming price reduction, one to fear most in this context.
3. Farmer Giles: Has perked up for Sherman, new jockey in Francisco Duran.

Longshot: Sanfran: Veteran has won twice over this turf course, could fire off bench for Wayne Baker.

Suggested play: Trifecta keying 7 with 2-3-8 with all and 2-3-8 with 7 with all.

Race 8

1. Switzers Da Man: Showed plenty of ability as a 2-year-old, not facing any Coils in this spot.
2. Magic Spirit: Protected after being claimed down south by Bill Morey, presence of leading rider a positive.
3. Undeniable Fact: Third in blanket finish as 4-5 choice, loses Baze to Magic Spirit.

Longshot: Dr. Procter: Put in spot where cannot be tagged after being taken for \$32,000 by Bud Klokstad, gelded son of Dehere can do better in second after lengthy hiatus.

Race 9

1. Western Roses: Has had no pace to run at in most recent, fractions should be swifter.
2. Summer Sunshine: Chased Triple Action in most recent, been 1-2-3 in six of nine on this turf course.
3. Simperio: Gained place by a neck, off rail and Baze stays for Morey.

Longshot: Bud I Crushed It: Split field at big number in return, benefits from outing and lone win was on turf.

Race 10

1. Gotnaceupersleeve: Ran second in lone try for this tag, exits race that produced a next out gradute (Jade Taylor).
2. Viognier: Hampered by slow start in better than looked debut for Lloyd Mason, flees fence.
3. Churchbellsringing: Drops into career soft spot for first of 2011, 1:01 2/5 work on tab.

Longshot: Cheeky Changa: Faced more expensive stock down south, adds blinkers and should improve with circuit shift.

Late 50 Cent Pick 4

Race 7-Big Sky Posse, Tropical Heat and Farmer Giles (Alternate: Sanfran).

Race 8-Switzers Da Man and Magic Spirit (A: Undeniable Fact).

Race 9-Summer Sunshine, Western Roses and Bud I Crushed It (A: Simperio).

Race 10-Gotnaceupersleeve, Viognier and Churchbellsringing (A: Cheeky Changa).

Total Cost (\$27)-3-7-8 with 4-10 with 3-9-10 with 2-3-10.
