He was one of three local front running winners on fast dirt at 8f July 22, and he should be all over the pace once again under his winning rider Hernandez. #2 Echosmith (3-1) switched to dirt, set the pace, and was second best at LRC June 26. Last time at DMR, he got pace to chase and rallied for the place. The versatile gelding is a logical threat if he maintains form in his third start after a layoff. #1 Street Ruckus (6-1) picks up more experienced rider Berrios and the early-pressing type might move up in his second start after a short layoff. #6 Rhetoric (5-2) controlled the pace and romped in his 6f MSW win at LRC July 9. He chased and finished a flat 5th as the beaten favorite at DMR Aug. 13. Baffert excels with the blinkers off move and he stretches out and should be forwardly placed under Geroux.

Comments: #4 Always At Ease (7-2) got a good education run when splitting a 10-horse field in her local 8T bow July 30. Keith D is a patient trainer and he shows a profit with second timers, and Curatolo sticks with the \$400k daughter of Twirling Candy. #5 La Paloma Blanca

(6-1) never got seriously involved in her local 5T bow Aug. 4. She adds blinkers and is bred to route, and and Miller shows a profit with second timers. Hernandez ends up here. #6 Tea N Conversation (6-1) stalked and ended up a non-threatening 7th of 10 in her local dirt sprint bow July 31. The \$400k daughter of Twirling Candy is bred to route and McCarthy shows a profit first route and first turf. #8 Three Strands (4-1) is a \$240k Empire Maker first timer and dam has produced five winners from six starters (1 stakes winner).

Valdivia Jr. was aboard for both of those wins and she should be right there throughout if she maintains form. #2 Keepmeinthe Moment (3-1) won a maiden claimer April 17 and a starter allowance event May 15. Both were all-weather sprints at GG and she attended the pace both times. She weakened vs. optional claimers last time and should make her presence felt from the outset if she handles dirt.

She does some of her best work at 8T and should be heard from late. #6 Fearless Girl (3-1) finally picked up her first US win in her sixth attempt at this course and distance July 23. She stalked and smartly earned her diploma at 6.5T June 5, and clicked right back in a local 8T starter allowance event Aug. 6. Curatolo rides her well and she must be respected in her current form. #2 Dancing Dana (5-1) had her four-race trifecta streak snapped when finishing 6th in a local state bred optional claimer Aug. 7. She fits with these on her best day. #1 **Taranta** (15-1) might outrun her odds for competent turf trainer Dollase. I have no problem with the rider switch to Berrios and she cuts back in distance and might spice up the exotics.

DMR 7 (MSW, CA-bred, 5.5f) **Primary - #10 KANGAROO COURT**

Comments: #10 Kangaroo Court (6-5) drew post 11 and scratched out of the Best Pal (G3) last Sunday. He ran well in his local CA-bred dirt sprint bow and that was a better than average affair. He set a fast pace and was run down by subsequent Graduation hero The Big Wam. If he runs back to his bow the others are in trouble. #11 Tom Horn (4-1) is a Grazen FTS and dam's other two starters won. Miyadi shows a +ROI with his debut MSW starters and he worked from the gate at DMR Aug. 14. #3 Reign of Speed (6-1) was pushed along from the rail and set the pace and was a clear 3rd in his SA bow. He chased Kangaroo Court last time and adds blinkers and should be a forward factor from the outset. Hanson continues to struggle at the current stand. #6 Duty First (8-1) had an uncomfortable trip when splitting a 10-horse field in his local sprint bow vs. this kind July 24. Dam has produced four winners from six starters and he might move up, bur Koriner does not have great stats with second timers.

Rispoli sticks with D'Amato's sharp filly and she figures to save ground while within striking range throughout. #11 **Spendarella** (8-5) won all three turf routes in this country last year and shipped to Great Britain and landed the place in the Coronation (G1) at Ascot June 17. Graham Motion saddled Friday's turf stakes winner at Del Mar. #9 **Txope** (5-1) won the German One Thousand Guineas (G2) when last seen June 12. Sadler has her now and she shows a trio of local works for this. **#5 Cairo Memories** (3-1) is 4-for-5 in SoCal turf routes. She captured her 8T bow at DMR last summer and won the Providencia (G3) and Honeymoon (G3) at this distance at SA earlier this year. #12 Ballet Dancing (20-1) is interesting at a big price. She finished in the top three in all four starts and earned a decent late pace rating in a runner-up finish July 24. They paid \$800k for this one and she reconnects with her winning rider Van Dyke.

DMR 9 (Clm-12.5k, 8f)

Comments: **#5 Little Demon** (5-2) landed the place in a pair of claimers at GP earlier this year, and shipped to DMR and dominated \$8k claimers as the 3-1 favorite at one mile July 28. Five horses were claimed out of that heat including this one, and he is an obvious threat if able to run two alike. **#4 Gray Magician** (7-2) rallied for the place in a local sprint from an outer post as the beaten chalk at the \$8k level Aug. 5. He was claimed that day and

Cedillo gets the mount again. #6 High Heater (5-1) stretches back out in his first start after the Wong claim. The five-time winner used to be able to route. #10 Of Good Report (12-1) should get pace to chase and figures to be closing under Berrios.

She might move forward in her second start after a long layoff following a wide 7th in her local July 30 return. #3 Leisurewear (4-1) battled on the pace and missed the place by a nose in similar local spot July 30, and that was her third solid turf route effort from as many attempts. Rispoli shows a profit with D'Amato and she has two solid local moves since her last. #6 Vivando (7-2) exits back-to-back runner-up finishes in similar turf routes. She figures to stalk the pace under her new rider Vazquez in her second start after a layoff. #11 Albayaader (6-1) chased lively fractions, was shuffled a bit, and ended up splitting a 12-horse field in her



Bill Mott's filly reunites with her winning rider Jose Ortiz.
